Completing the State Required Auditor General Budget Forms and the Inconsistencies in Cities/Towns 9 - 9:50 AM (1 CPE)

Megan Suzanne Smith, CPA, Accountability Services Manager, Arizona Auditor General As required by Arizona State statute, cities and towns must prepare annual budgets on forms the Arizona Auditor General developed. This session will discuss the Arizona Auditor General's role in developing the forms and instructions. However, how cities and towns complete these forms varies depending on whether they are under the state expenditure limitation, or a voter approved alternative expenditure limitation such as the permanent base adjustment or home rule and the various inconsistencies in cities' and towns' budgeting process.
